I am a founding member of OURS-Winnipeg (Outdoor Urban Recreational Spaces-Winnipeg). After reading "CUPE ripped as golf-course leases die" by Bartley Kives on May 30, I dropped my cup of morning coffee immediately to respond to this analysis.

Mr. Kives has given far too much credit to Councillor Wyatt's tirade in the Council Chambers yesterday against CUPE.

In fact, I was totally incensed by his report in the Winnipeg Free Press.
